Review of the 2022 Inventory of Research

Purpose

The purpose of the paper is to update the Board on the Inventory of Research and on related website statistics.

Decision

No decision is required.

Background

In 2020, the Board adopted the recommendations in the Report of the Working Group for the Review of SALSEA-Track and the Inventory of Research, ICR(20)07. Amongst other things, it was agreed that:

- 1. The Inventory is posted on the website as a single spreadsheet so that users can easily interrogate it.
- 2. Website statistics are presented to the Board annually so it can understand the extent to which the Inventory is used.

The Inventory of Research Relating to Salmon Mortality in the Sea (the Inventory)

In November 2022, the Secretariat sent the relevant portion of the spreadsheet to the Parties with a request that they update it. Parties were asked to return the update by the end of December 2022. The Secretariat posted the updated Inventory spreadsheet on the website in early 2023. This can be found at: <u>https://salmonatsea.com/research-inventory/</u>.

In total there are 185 projects included in the Inventory: 107 are completed and 70 are ongoing. There are two new entries. These are:

- a study from European Union Sweden '<u>Genetic evidence of farmed straying and</u> <u>introgression in Swedish wild salmon populations</u>'. This is a pilot study aimed at detecting and quantifying genotypes and genes with escaped farmed (Norwegian) origin in Swedish wild salmon rivers.
- a project based in Nordic Countries on 'Nordic cooperation on salmon health' which involves monitoring and exchange of expertise with regards to work on salmon health.

The Board Website

In 2021, two tables were provided containing benchmark information that could be used as a comparison with future website hits statistics.

Table 1 shows statistics on visits to the Board's website from 2015 - 2023.

Page Views: number of times a page is viewed;

Unique Page Views: number of sessions during which a page was viewed one or more times (i.e. page views from the same user during the same session are aggregated);

Avg Time on Page: average time a visitor stays on the page (minutes and seconds);

Entrances: number of times this was the first page viewed on site, e.g. linked to from a Google Search;

% Bounce Rate: % of visitors that navigate away from the website after only viewing one page; and

% Exit: % of visitors who exit the website from this page and do not go on to look at any other pages associated with the website.
